

SOE OFFICE: Voters Beware of Another Misleading Mail Campaign

The Bradford County Supervisor of Elections Office wants to warn voters of a mail campaign by the Voter participation (VPC) and the Center for Voter Information (CVI), which began in Florida this week. The VPC is a non-government organization and NOT affiliated with the Bradford County SOE Office, or any state election office. These mailings can potentially be misleading and cause confusion for recipients.

In previous mailings, VPC has used unverified sources to pull personal information. As a result, letters have been set to currently registered voters, deceased individuals, minor children, and occasionally even pets. These mailings not only cause concern, but also undermines the public's trust in the elections process.

These letters may include voter registration applications and say a number of things including:

- You are not registered to vote.
- Your mailing address is incorrect.
- Your voter information needs to be updated.

Again, the VPC and CVI are non-government organizations and this mailing is NOT affiliated with the Bradford County SOE Office, or any state election office, and may not reflect the voter information we have on file.

The Bradford County SOE Office makes every effort to update voter information and maintain accurate registration.
